

Hawai'i ranks 2nd in the nation for the adoption of EVs.



Hawai'i has a target "to sequester more atmospheric carbon and greenhouse gases than emitted within the state as quickly as practicable, but no later than 2045."



60 EVs currently in HDOT's fleet

147

EV pick-up trucks for HDOT's fleet (35 received to date)

100+ HE

Level II & III chargers at HDOT facilities include 4 NEVI chargers

Hawai'i's STSFA-funded Road Usage Demonstration Project laid a foundation for successful legislation and implementation.





Key factors in moving from research and planning to implementation:



A strong foundation of research, analysis, and feedback.



Hawaii's commitment to reducing greenhouse gas emissions by 2045.



Engaging key legislators.



On-going engagement with key organizations and stakeholders.

In 2023, Hawai'i became the fourth state to adopt RUC.

Regular communication and briefings with legislative stakeholders.




Strong support from the Executive Branch.




Developed modest, well-crafted legislation.

Hawai'i's existing vehicle inspection system ensures all vehicles are inspected regularly and each vehicle's odometer recorded.




31 Other States with Safety or Emissions Inspections

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

In 2025, proposed legislation would authorize Hawai'i counties to enact their own road usage charges in 2028.

The legislation would:

 Authorize the counties to enact county RUC and set their own RUC rate for EVs as a replacement for the county fuel tax starting July 1, 2028. Repeal the RUC
 cap of \$50 in the state
 RUC effective July 1,
 2028.

We're also working on a long-term plan to transition all vehicles to road usage charging no later than 2033.
